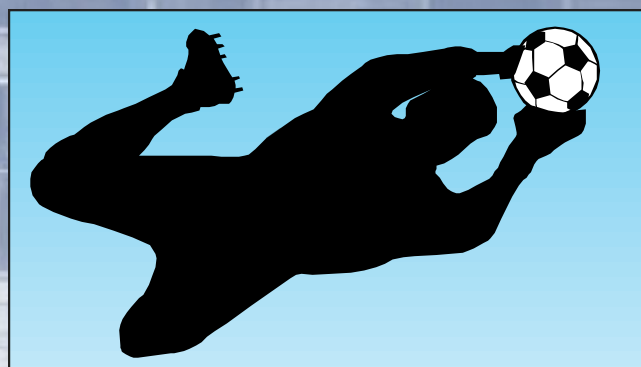

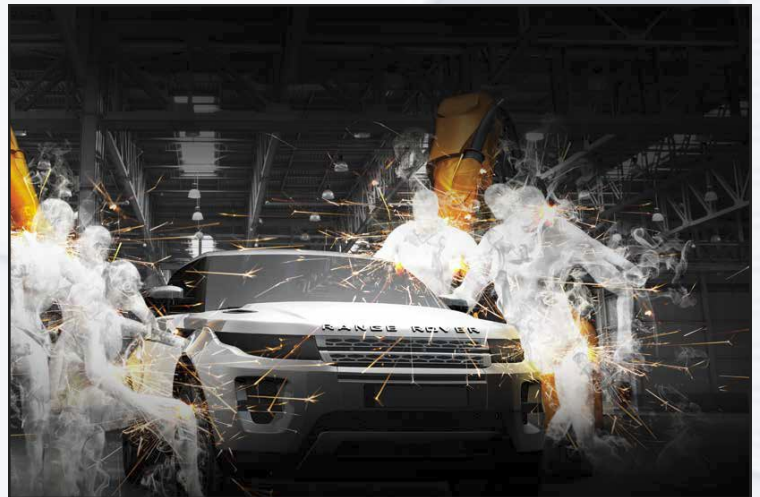

Duke of Edinburgh bronze level training expedition

Last weekend 25 students from year 10 embarked on their first expedition of the course when they visited Clanfield in Oxfordshire.

The students did brilliantly considering the adverse weather conditions over the two days. It was amazing to see them progress in so many ways developing essential life skills as well as specific attributes needed for the award such as navigating, cooking and setting up tents.

Students had the chance to use Windmill Farm's climbing wall during their free time on Saturday night which the students loved and this unearthed some fantastic spider men and women (Maryam R.!!). On Sunday everyone demonstrated core Broadway values such as optimism and aspiration as they managed to walk 15km despite the windy weather and the fact that some of them had only had 2 hours sleep (Akmed M. and Rayaana S. in particular!).
