Expectations and Ambitions

Dear Parent and Students,

This week, I have been asking staff to reiterate our behaviour expectations to all students in terms of the 3 P's at the start of every assembly, form period and lesson. We are also re-enforcing our expectations on the corridors and to students. When we work on this collectively, as a staff-parent-student team, it will have huge impact on the quality of students behaviour and make Broadway an even better Academy for everyone to belong to.



P - Polite - I have been emphasising and asking staff and older students to role model the importance of good manners: opening doors for staff and each other, speaking pleasantly to each other using "please" and "thank you". **Very good Behaviour**, outside the classroom and in the building, is evident when students are: **polite and walk quickly and quietly on the left, straight to where they should be**. Running and letting off steam - within reason - should only happen in the playground!

P- Prepared - students should have, correct uniform, no make-up, pencil cases, books, homework and an excellent attitude to learning.

P- Persevere - We want our school community and students to be able to cope with setbacks, to keep pressing on and to succeed in their own right. (This is really important, especially with the new curriculum and terminal exams. It is also a key life skill). We need to plan opportunities for students to 'struggle' in their lessons, extra-curricular activities and in their homework.

It is our ambition to be the best school in the country for students' progress by 2020. I look forward to working with you to make this ambition a reality.

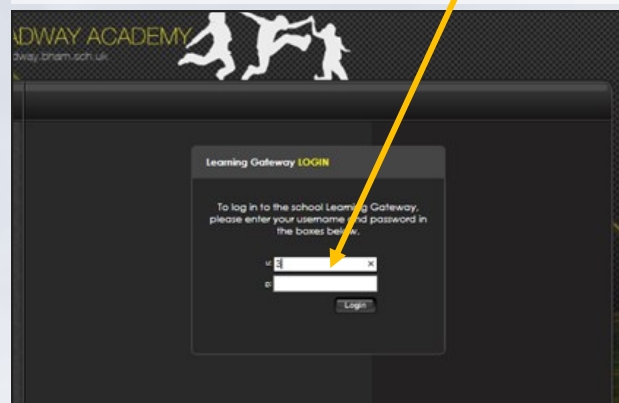


Homework on Frog - How to access your child's homework

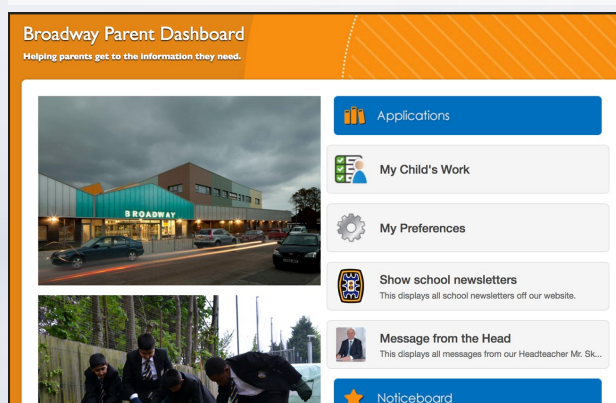
1 - Click on Virtual Learning (in blue, by the top right)



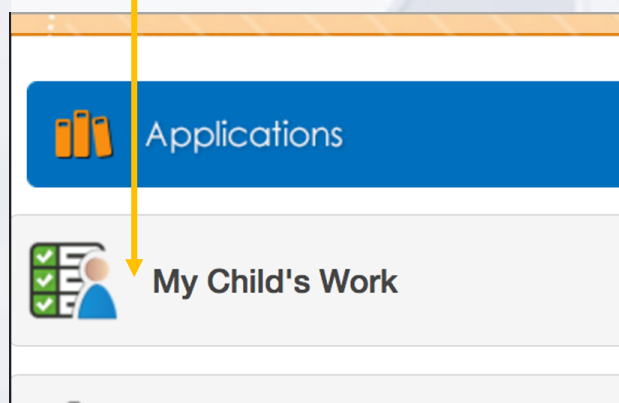
2 - Enter the username and password you have been given by school.

5b - Click the title of the home work to see details information.

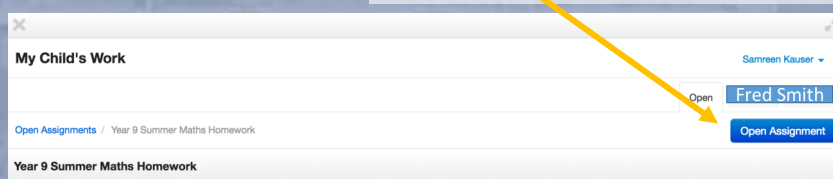
5c - If you have more than one child in the school, you can pick which child to view by clicking the arrow

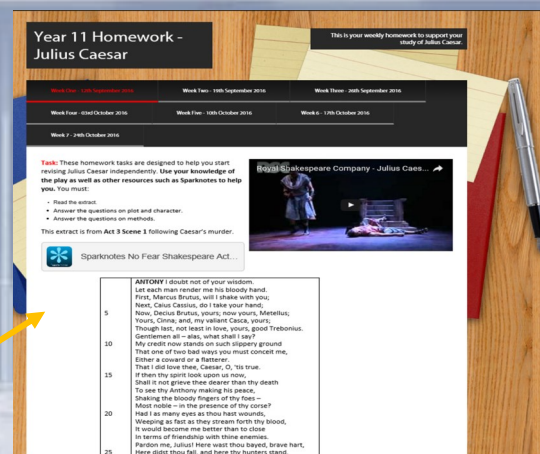

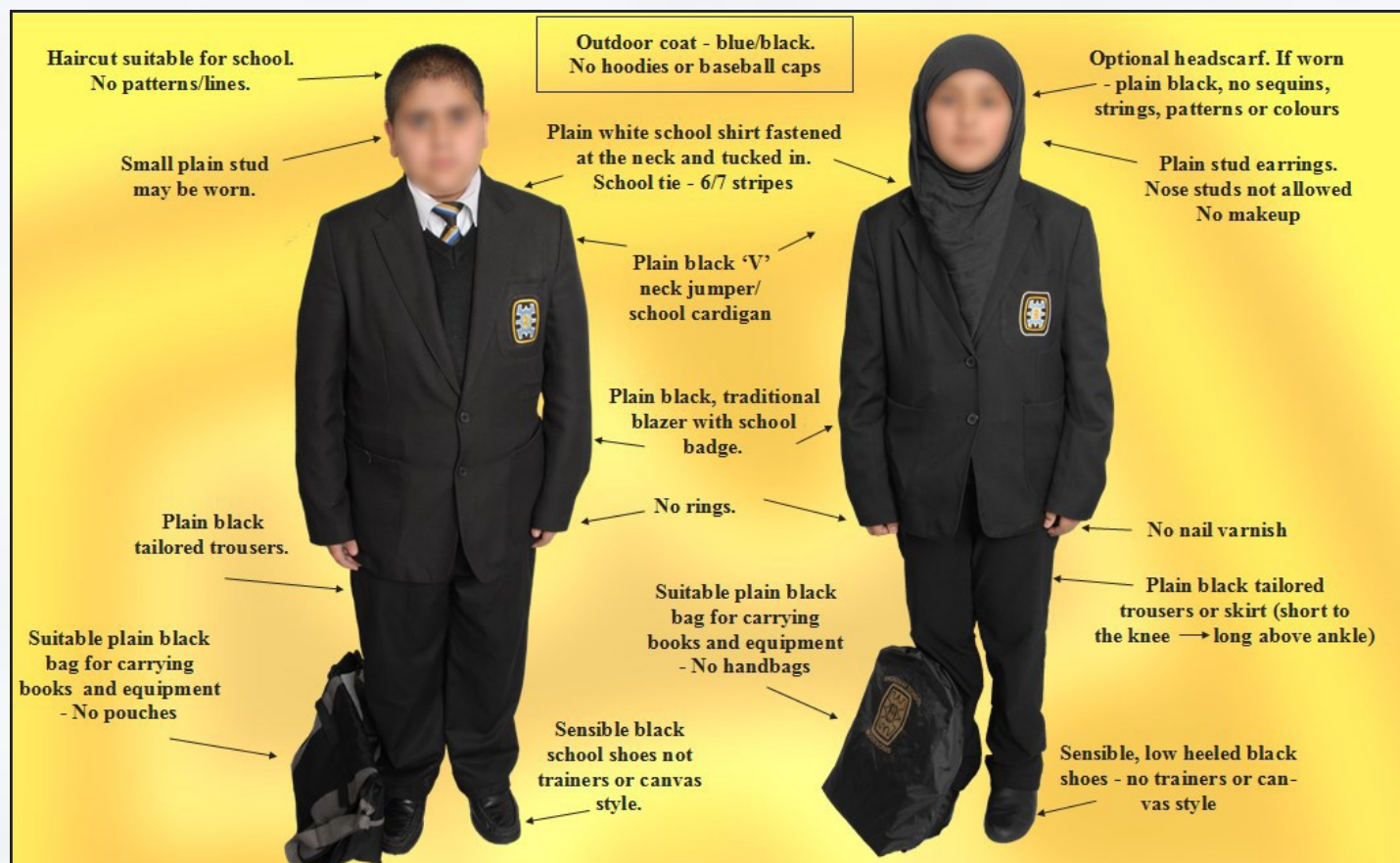
