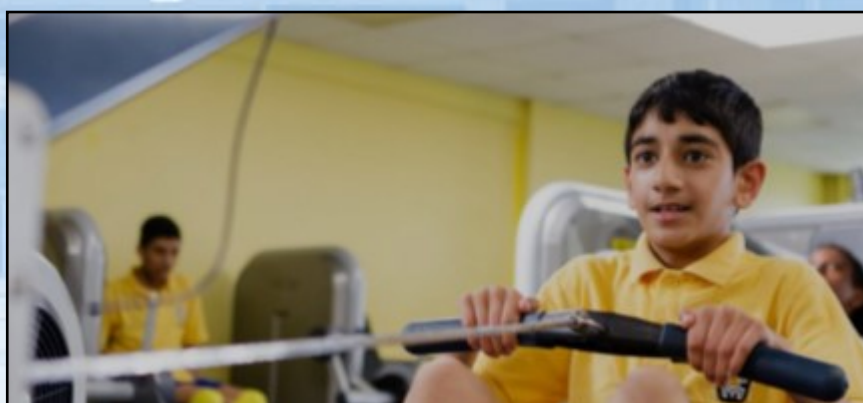
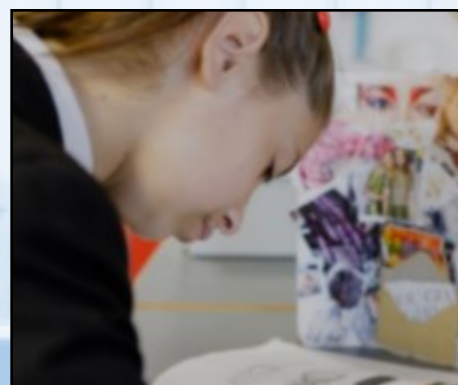

Welcome to Broadway Academy,

Transition to secondary school can be an exciting and nerve racking time for students but we aim to try and answer all your questions and provide you with plenty of information, so you feel settled and confident when you join us in September.

In September your Student Support Manager (SSM) will be here to support you and your year group. But in the meantime please use this booklet for support.

This booklet has been carefully put together, to provide families of children moving into Year 7 with as much information and advice as possible, enabling transition from primary to secondary education to be as smooth and stress-free as it can be. The booklet is also chronological in layout; the information at the front of the booklet is information you will need now, moving through the pages towards the information you will need for September. However, it is also important to regularly check out our website, as we also put vital letters, information and videos on there.

We are often in the top 10% of schools nationally for attendance and GSSE exam results and in the top 2% of schools (according to PISA DATA 2023) for students' hope and optimism.

Broadway Academy Objectives

The objectives for Broadway Academy 2024 -2029 are to:

1. To deliver an Exceptional Educational Experience through a rich and diverse curriculum.

- Ensure attendance and punctuality is outstanding.
- Throughout the curriculum, assemblies, extra-curricular programmes and partnerships with faith communities there is a focus on students' spiritual, cultural, mental and physical development.
- Further develop the extra-curricular and co-curricular experience, for all students with a particular focus on the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme, Drama, outdoor education at Island Pool and outdoor learning at Esperance Farm.
- Become a Centre of Excellence for RE, Sport and Music.
- Increase sixth form numbers and expand the curricular offer, in the sixth form, to include vocational courses particularly associated with Esperance Farm and Island Pool Outdoor Centre.
- We know that life is not linear and we want to prepare students for the challenges of life. We develop students' character through a vibrant and exciting curriculum including assemblies, collective worship and established links with faith partners.
- RE is a core subject for all students which helps them to explore the paradoxes and mysteries of faith and life, we believe it is important to contribute to their spiritual development, their Religious Literacy and their resilience. 2. To deliver exceptional teaching and learning that yields excellent outcomes for students.

- Develop highly motivated, effective, reflective and passionate teachers who inspire a love of learning with all their students

Summer Term

We fully understand the size and nature of the changes that lie ahead for you, so it is vitally important to us that you are fully supported throughout the transition process.

This support can be nurtured through the development of strong relationships which is why our support activities start in June as you complete Year 6.

Between May and July you will get a visit to your primary school from your SSM or Assistant Headteacher. The aim of this visit is for you to meet and talk through all the key things you need to know about Broadway Academy and also answer all the questions you have before you arrive. We understand this can be a really exciting time but also a very nerve racking time, so the aim of this is to put you at ease. This year we are doing a mix of visits and online discussions and your primary school will inform you if and when you are due a visit.

Wednesday 1st July and Thursday 2nd July 2026 are our transition days where you will come and visit Broadway Academy. During this time you can begin to get to know your new class mates, get to know your form tutor, take part in some fun lessons, assemblies and workshops. The time is also spent familiarising yourselves with the building and arrangements for lunch and break, so when September arrives, you are far less apprehensive about what you will face.

If you have special educational needs or an EHCP plan, you will also get an additional visit from our SENCO, Razia Ali. Getting ready for September

Buying school uniform

Parents and children are asked to co-operate with the Governors and staff by ensuring that the conduct and uniform of the students is commendable and the impression the school gives in the community, is a favourable one. The majority of our uniform can be purchased at supermarkets, however, for branded Broadway jumpers and PE kits these can be purchased from:

Ties and badges can be purchased at the main school reception at £6 each.

As a school, aside from recommending our current reputable uniform provider to parents, who stock the range required, we do not have any commercial agreements in place. However, if we discover alternative suppliers that offer greater value to parents while ensuring the same quality and range, we are open to exploring those options. Additionally, except for branded ties and blazers, we welcome parents and carers to utilise other suppliers, provided the items align with our uniform standards and offer better value to families.

Blazer	Black with school badge
Trousers or skirts	Standard school type – black, in plain fabric tailored below the ankle. It is not acceptable to wear corduroy, denim, linen, checked, striped, patterned, leggings, skinny fit. Skirts should be standard school design to the knee. These should not be tight and short. Plain black tights should be worn under skirts, it is not acceptable to wear leggings.
Shirt	Standard school type shirt with collar in plain white which should always be tucked in.
School Tie	Tie with Broadway livery
Jumper	Plain black 'V' neck in knitted yarn with Broadway badge, it is not acceptable to wear sweatshirts/tracksuits/hooded tops.
Shoes	Plain black and low heeled (Trainer, boots, fashion shoes, sandals, sling back etc are not permitted)
PE kit	Branded royal blue T-shirt with school badge, branded royal blue outdoor top with school badge, plain black shorts, plain black tracksuit bottoms, black football socks, astro trainers and towel.

Getting ready for September

Outdoor wear	Coats/anoraks should be in a plain fabric and outdoor wear should not be worn inside the building, in teaching or dining areas. Items of outdoor clothing worn inside, will be confiscated in line with the school's policies.
Make up	Make up and nail varnish are not permitted.
Hair styles	Pupils are only allowed to have natural hair colouring. Greens, blues, reds, silver-shades etc. are not allowed. Inappropriate fashion hairstyles are also not allowed. These include, very short 'crew-cut' hairstyles, extreme styles, decorative shaved elements and motifs.
Jewellery	1 stud in each ear are the only jewellery permitted.
Fashion accessories	MP3's, IPod's, airpods are not permitted. Mobile phones must be placed in a Yondr pouch. Your child will be given a Yondr pouch at the start of the year. These items will be confiscated in line with school policies if seen.
Bags	A pupil's main school bag must be large enough to properly carry an A4 ring binder and equipment safely. Smaller bags are not appropriate as a main school bag. 'Handbag' or 'purse' type bags for girls are not appropriate as a main school bag.
Shoes	All students must wear plain black shoes that have no logos or white/coloured decorative elements. Boots and trainers are NOT allowed. Backless, suede or cloth footwear is totally inappropriate and can be a health and safety hazard when using the many staircases in school or when working in some classroom environments.

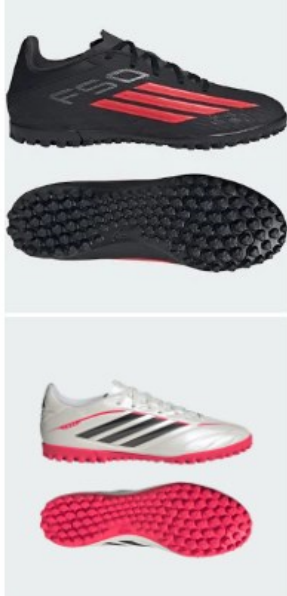
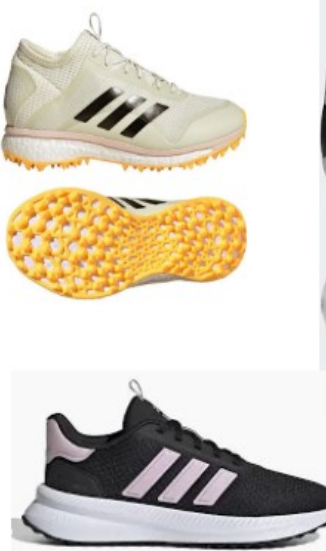

Astro Trainers

We are very lucky to have a new astro turf at Broadway. Students taking part in PE lessons on the Astro Turf pitch must wear the correct footwear. Astro turf trainers are the only approved footwear and must be worn for all lessons on the Astro. These trainers are widely available and can be purchased from retailers such as Sports Direct, Decathlon, JD Sports, and other sports shops. Please see the guidance below

Under no circumstances can metal studs or flat sole trainers be worn on the Astro Turf pitch. Students must ensure that the footwear guidelines are followed at all times. PE staff will check that the correct footwear is being worn, and students who arrive with unsuitable footwear will be refused entry to the astro and will be required to borrow suitable footwear.

Expectations of the PE Department

- Students must always bring their full PE kit to every lesson.
- If a student is unable to take part practically, they will still be expected to change into their PE kit and participate in the learning activities where appropriate.
- Sanctions may be applied when students forget items of PE kit.
- If students forget their PE kit, they may be required to wear spare kit provided by the school.
- The correct PE kit and Astro Turf trainers must be brought to every PE lesson.
- Any student with long hair must bring a hair bobble and ensure their hair is tied back for all PE lessons.
- Female students who wear a headscarf must bring a pull-over sports hijab/ headscarf suitable for PE lessons to ensure safety and full participation in practical activities.

School Uniform Expectations

We expect a smart and professional appearance at all times including hairstyles that are in accordance with school policy. Pupils are expected to observe the dress code at all times when they are at school or involved in school related activities.

Uniform presents an image of the academy to the community at large and we hope that all concerned with the academy will ensure that a positive image is maintained.



Breeches of the dress code will be dealt with as acts of disobedience under the academy's behaviour policy.

Parents are strongly advised to mark clearly all personal items.

If you are concerned, as to whether an item is permitted as acceptable uniform; please consult the academy before you purchase the items.

Basic school equipment pupils must have

You must have the following equipment:

A pencil case; 2 black or blue ball-point pens; 2 pencils; an eraser; a pencil sharpener; a compass; a protractor, a 30 cm ruler and a scientific calculator.

As well as your basic equipment listed above you must also always carry your school planner with you (which you will be provided with in September) and a reading book.

Should the need arise during the course of the school year, the school shop, located in the Library, sells pens, pencils and other writing equipment.

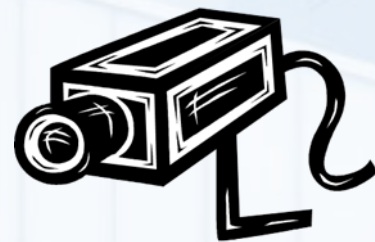
Arriving in September

In September you will not know your timetable so members of school staff will be on hand to direct you straight to the schools main hall where your SSM will be waiting for you.

Security

Broadway Academy is fitted with video security cameras, situated at various parts of the school, which are relayed to a television screen. There are time locks on all of the outside doors and the school can only be entered by students through the front door, at certain times (stated below).

Should parents wish to visit the school, they are asked to enter the school by the front entrance, where they will be greeted by security. Here they will have to sign in and wait to be accompanied into the school by the person they are visiting.

SSM and Form Tutors

You will have a Student Support Manager (SSM) who is responsible for all students in Year 7 and their Student Support Assistant (SSA).

Your Form Tutor will look after your everyday needs and will be introduced to you on your first day at school.

Lessons at Broadway Academy

Lessons

It will probably be a few days until we get you into lessons as you will spend some time in September in your form classes, getting to know each other and becoming familiar with are systems. However, the Subjects you will be taught are:

You will be given a timetable to follow which you will stick in to your school planner. Don't worry everything is colour coded so it's really easy to find your way around and if you get stuck just ask.



Break and lunchtimes

There is a canteen in school that offers a wide selection of meals and snacks at breaktime and lunchtime.

A packed lunch can be brought from home to be eaten in the cafeteria.

All pupils stay on school site at lunchtime and are expected to go outside if not eating.



If you are receiving free school meals in your present school you will probably be entitled to them at Broadway Academy. Your parents will be given a form in September which will need returning to Broadway so we can check if you are still entitled to them.

Broadway Academy works on a cashless system called ParentPay. This allows money to be transferred to your account and put into machines and then you pay using your fingerprint.

For the first few days all students will get free school meals until fingers prints have been recorded and added to the school system. We will then notify parents by text when your child needs to start bringing in their money or use their Free School Meal entitlement.

Free School Meals

If you are entitled to FSM please be aware you can only use your allowance at either break or lunchtime (not both) so you may wish to bring extra money in if you want something at an alternative time.

If you are not already entitled to free school meals. You may be entitled to claim for them. It is worth checking on this website.

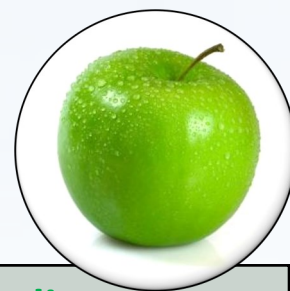

The School Day

At the end of school

Detentions

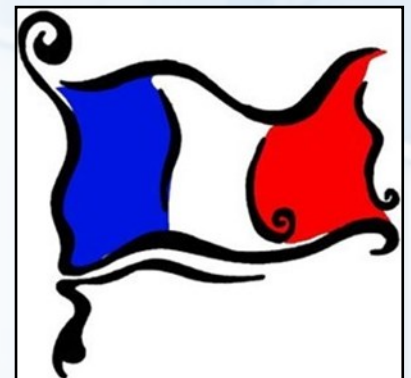
These run after school and your parents will be notified by Arbor if you have been issued a detention.

Communication

Please ensure you provide the academy with any changes to your mobile telephone numbers. The academy send out a lot of information via text message and email so it is imperative we have at least **2 correct numbers and parents email addresses** .

Clubs and activities

As a balance to the academic life of the academy, you are encouraged to participate in activities which are outside the normal curriculum. Our Physical Education Department has developed the following clubs: Football, Judo, Badminton, Basketball, Table Tennis, Volleyball, Gymnastics, Athletics, Cricket, Hockey, Netball, Dance and Rounders. These are arranged according to demand and support. The Technology Department allows access to computers and other technology at lunch times and after school. Many other members of staff give up their free time to run other clubs and activities too.



Arrangements can be made for students to attend residential courses, such as the Outward Bound course and Duke of Edinburgh, if there is sufficient demand and support.

We encourage all our students to take part in extracurricular activities and you will be notified by text if they are staying late for an activity.

Parental Meetings and Homework

Formal Meetings with Parents

Parent will have the opportunity to meet formally with staff on two occasions during year 7.

At least once a year (annual review), for parents with a child who has an EHCP are invited into school to discuss progress and any further support that may be needed for their child.

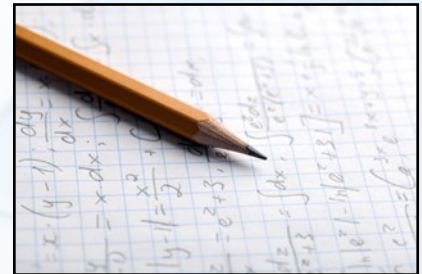

Homework is compulsory. We know that both teachers and parents feel that homework is a vital part of your education. There is a homework timetable for all years. You are issued with a pupil planner and this should be checked each day by your parents. The co-operation and encouragement of parents in this matter, by seeing that the work is done conscientiously, is extremely important. A lot of the homework now is set online using fun interactive programmes which give you your results straight away, your teacher will give you more information on this when you start.



Assessment and Rewards

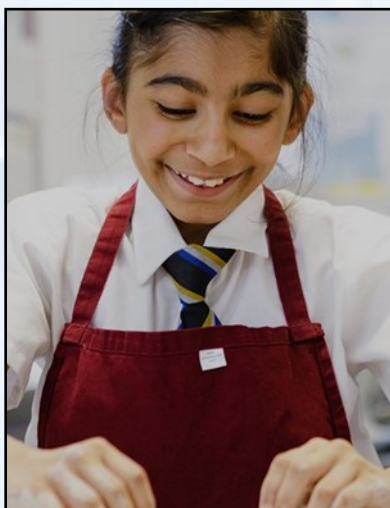
Assessment

Assessment is key in ensuring progress at Broadway Academy and we do this in a number of ways. Mainly through informal questioning during lessons but also through more formal tests 3 times per year at KS3. Parents will be sent the results. We report to parents regularly regarding progress and attainment through formal reports, interim data reports and parents evenings. However, if parents ever wish to discuss academic progress they can contact the student support manager (SSM) who can offer further guidance.

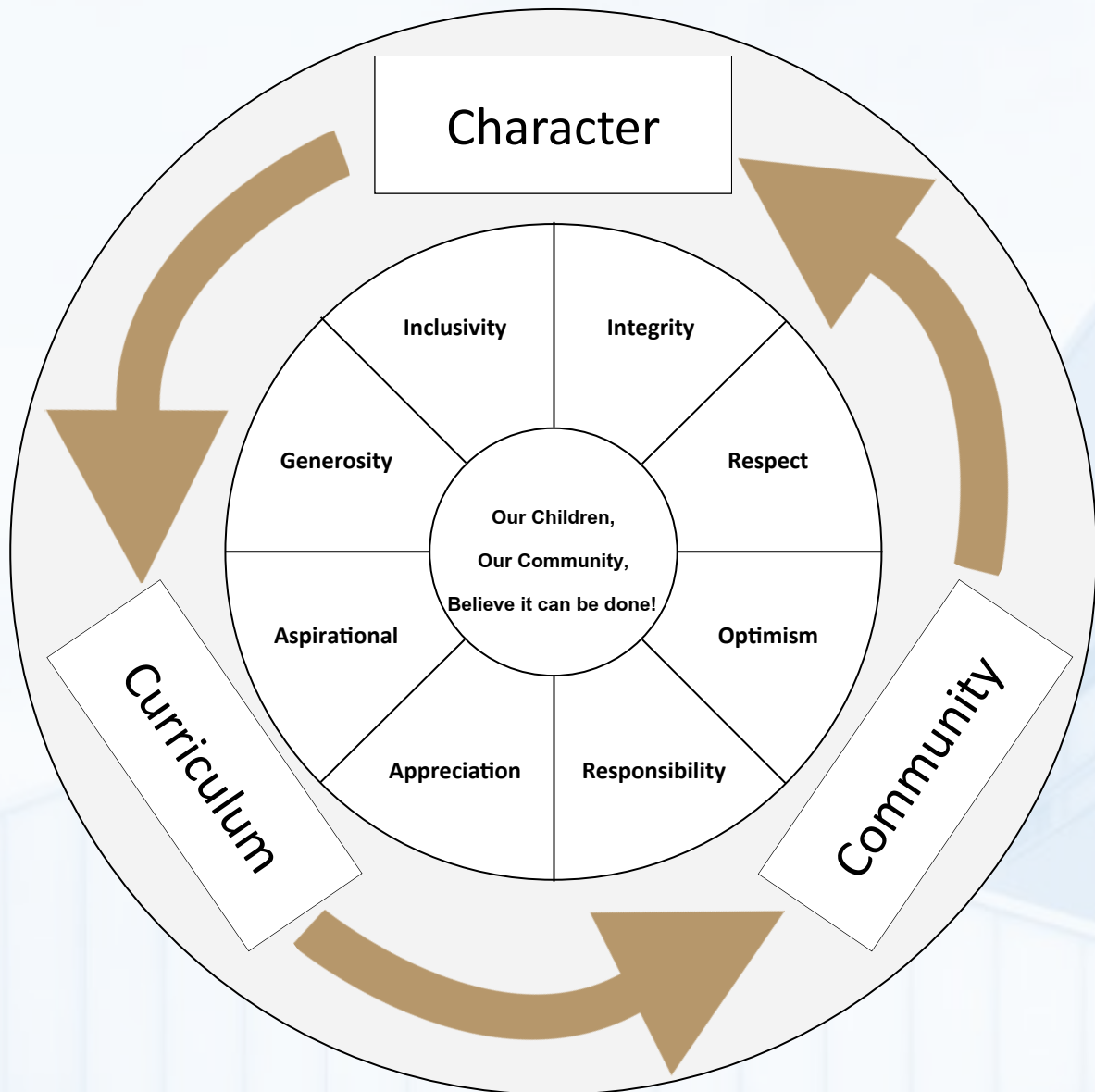
Rewards

Behaviour

• Attending the academy every day. • Arrive at the academy for 8.30am and be punctual to all lessons. • Wear the correct uniform at all times (ensuring shirts are tucked in, coats are off in the building, jewellery is limited to 1 ear stud). • Bringing the correct equipment to every lesson for example school bag, stationary, planner, reading book, specialist equipment such as PE kit. • Mobile phones must be placed in a Yondr pouch • Completing all work to a high standard. • Completing homework.	• Being polite and using good manners at all times. • Entering the classroom quietly and sitting in allocated seats • Giving the lesson full focus by listening, concentrating and completing the work set by the teacher • In class, make it possible for all pupils to learn, avoid disrupting the learning of others (i.e. shouting out, messing around) • Accept sanctions when given. • Celebrate success of others. • Value other opinions and speak appropriately to peers. • Treat the school buildings and school property with respect. • Refrain from behaving in a way that brings the school into disrepute, including when outside school.	• Move sensibly, calmly and purposefully through the corridors adhering to the one-way system. • Queue calmly and quietly as instructed. • Only use your allocated spaces during break and lunch time. • Use social media wisely. • Behave maturely while at the academy. • Represent the academy appropriately when in the community. • Report any unsafe behaviour to a member of staff (i.e. bullying, disagreements/ fighting, inappropriate social media use, community concerns)

Our behaviour policy seeks to encourage you to make positive choices and re-enforces those choices through praise and rewards. The academy recognises that even when encouraged to make the right choice, some of you will occasionally make choices that disrupt your own learning or that of others. A series of strategies will then need to be used to bring about changes to these behaviours. The aim of these strategies is to encourage you to comply with the rules and re-engage with learning.

Attendance

Each year, a number of students in every year group achieve 100% attendance records, showing that this is an achievable target. In addition, a number of students have achieved this level of attendance in successive years.

Broadway Academy expects all our students to achieve a minimum of **97% attendance**.

Good attendance at school is vital for pupils to achieve their full educational potential. Pupils with good attendance records benefit in the following ways:-

- Continuity of learning which makes progress and retention easier
- Improved performance in assessment tasks
- Enhanced performance in examinations
- Continuity of relationships and friendships
- Good references for further education or employment
- Good habits are formed for later life



Parents play a very important role in ensuring the good attendance records of their children. We ask you to support your child getting good attendance by:

- Encouraging full attendance.
- Stress the importance of full attendance to your child.
- Do not allow your child to have time off for minor complaints or illnesses: if they are well enough to be up and about they are generally well enough to attend the academy.
- Monitor your child's attendance.
- Try to book any medical or dental appointments out of Academy hours or make them for the very end of the academy day.
- Ensure your child is punctual to the Academy, students should be in school at 8.30am.
- Inform the Academy on the first day of absence.
- Take any vacations in Academy holidays, not during term time.
